The Safety Department has been charged with establishing a proactive and aggressive program designed to detect and minimize hazards as well as advance safety awareness throughout the Squadron. The success of this program is dependent on the active and enthusiastic participation of all hands.

- ✓ All personnel are responsible for correcting any hazard or unsafe condition.
- ✓ Unnecessary risk will not be accepted. Operational Risk Management (ORM) will be utilized throughout the planning and execution phases of all flight operations, maintenance actions, embark operations, and off duty activities.
- ✓ Strict compliance with all Orders, Directives, and Standing Operating Procedures is fundamental to the success of this program.
- ✓ Maintenance Actions shall be completed by the book and correctly the first time.
- ✓ Look out for your fellow Marines and Sailors; take care of one another.
- ✓ Know your aircraft and emergency procedures cold.
- ✓ No mission in Training, Contingency Operations, or Combat is so critical that it must be flown in violation of established Operating Limits or Procedures.
