

Marine Air Support Squadron 2 Commanding Officer's Statement on Substance Abuse



The Pacific Vagabond Tribe is one of the most critical agencies that forms our Nation's forward edge, thus we must be ready when our Nation and her partners call. As ambassadors, our Marines, Sailors, and Families must demonstrate highest moral character on and off duty. In order to promote the safety and well-being of the members of this Squadron and to be honorable representatives of our country, the following is prohibited:

- Driving while under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other substance that impairs judgement or reaction ability.
- Consuming alcohol under the age of 20
- Excessively consuming alcohol to a level that is detrimental to health, good order, and discipline
- Consuming alcohol prior to or during official duty, resulting in impairment while performing official duties
- Possessing, distributing, manufacturing, or purchasing illegal drugs, synthetic drugs, and prescription drugs without a valid prescription
- Consuming or inhaling any illegal substance, or legal substance not meant for ingestion, with the intent of becoming intoxicated

In order to take care of our Tribe, every Marine, Sailor, and Family member must report any known or presumed substance abuse. Early reporting will ensure we can intervene and support the effected member in any treatment needed. If you believe you may have a problem with drinking or substance abuse, contact the Marine Air Support Squadron 2 Substance Abuse Control Officer (SACO) to obtain information and resources to help you.
