Marine Education



TRANSITION READINESS PROGRAM

The Transition Readiness Program (TRP) ensures that Marines are prepared for their transition from military to civilian life and provides Marines and their families with the tools and resources needed to pursue the Department of Defense-directed Career Readiness Standards.

Initial/Pre-Separation Counseling

Attendees will discuss their transitional goals, receive relevant resource referrals, and review options for supplemental workshops and training. Initial counseling must be completed prior to the Pre-Separation Counseling Brief.



TRS

Explore topics like employment, VA benefits, financial planning, transition resources, etc., and receive one-on-one guidance from a Personal and Professional Development Advisor. Completion of Initial Counseling and Pre-Separation Counseling is required prior to attendance at TRS.



Skill Bridge

The DOD SkillBridge program is an opportunity for active-duty military members to gain valuable civilian work experience through specific industry training, apprenticeships, or internships during the last 180 days of active duty service.



Veteran Affairs

Veterans can earn a range of benefits that help them transition back to civilian life in the country they fought to defend. The VA helps service members transition out of military service and assists with education, home loans, life insurance, and much more.



Career Expos

Career Expos provide you with a great opportunity to network with employers and learn all about different job and training opportunities. Come get more information on all the career-building resources available to you and ensure a successful start to your new career path.


Testing Services
